Fort Lupton Annual City-Wide Yard Sale

July 17th and 18th

This is the 9th Fort Lupton Annual City-Wide Yard Sale. In 2009, the City hosted the 1st City-Wide Yard Sale, it was advertised as "Attention Yard Sale Junkies", your dreams have come true.

Well, this event has made a lot of citizen's dreams come true, we have had more than 200 homes participate in the event since its creation.

The City's garage sales restrictions are as follows:

- * Sales shall be limited to the principal or accessory structure and to the driveway of the dwelling.
- * Sales shall be limited in duration to forty-eight (48) hours and to four (4) such sales per property per year.
- * Sales shall follow the sign code as defined in Fort Lupton Municipal Code, Chapter 16, Article VII.



**No City Permit Required
Doesn't Count as a Yard Sale**

This yard sale is exempt from the City's regulation in regard to the number of yard sales you can hold annually.

As part of the event the ARC Thrift Store truck will be located on the north side of the Safeway parking lot on Saturday, July 18th, between 2:00-4:00 p.m. to accept donations of any unsold items.

ARC does have some restrictions in regard to what they will pick up. The following items won't be accepted:

Televisions, computer monitors, baby walkers, playpens, strollers, swings, child car seats, carpet materials, mattresses, box springs, curtain rods, window blinds, glass, unframed mirrors, gas powered yard equipment, propane tanks, hot water tanks, building materials, satellite dishes, car batteries, tires, paint, pressurized containers and hazardous waste.



Reconstruction of 14th Street



The City has several street projects under construction from July through December. The reconstruction of 14th Street, between Denver Avenue and Highway 85 should begin in August. The reconstruction project will include the installation of new water, sewer and storm drainage lines. After all utilities are installed, 14th Street will be constructed with concrete to help facilitate heavy truck traffic.

As part of this project Factory Circle will receive replacements of sewer lines and storm drainage.

During the construction period it is staff's decision to have at least one lane of traffic open at all times. However there could be times alternate routes might be used to help complete this project. Completion of this project is December of this year.

This project as well as several other street projects were funded by dollars received from the Department of Local Affairs. This project cost is \$1,894,000; the City received \$750,000 from the grant.

Call for Nominations—November 3, 2015 Election

The City of Fort Lupton will participate in a coordinated election with Weld County on November 3, 2015 to elect Councilmembers from Ward I, Ward II, and Ward III. The current terms of the following will terminate in November 2015; Councilmembers in Ward I—Shannon Rhoda and David Crespin; Ward II—Chris Ceretto; Ward III—Chris Cross. In Ward I, Ward II and

Ward III, all positions will be a four-year terms and also in Ward I there will be one two-year term. Persons interested in becoming a candidate for Councilmember positions must meet the following requirements: 1) Be a registered elector, 2) Be at least 18 years of age on the date of the election and 3) must have resided within their ward for a period of at least twelve (12) consecutive

months immediately preceding the date of election.

Candidates shall be nominated by petition without regard to political party affiliations. Forms may be obtained on or after August 4, 2015, from the office of the City Clerk at 130 S. 9th Street to be Repaved

This month, the City will begin repaving 9th Street from Fulton Ditch to College Avenue. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of the month; weather permitting. During the construction period, 9th Street will be closed between Northrup Avenue and College Avenue. Alternate routes will be Rollie Avenue or College Avenue for the north/south routes.
